# **SERVANT OUTREACH PROJECT**

Our January outreach project is a school supply drive for enCircle's new Lynchburg Minnick School that opened in downtown Lynchburg last August. The enCircle (formerly Lutheran Family Services of Virginia) Minnick Schools help students ages five to twenty-two who have experienced challenges in public schools reach their academic, behavioral, vocational, and developmental goals. Minnick Schools are licensed by the Virginia Department of Education as private day schools and now serve students in the Bristol, Grundy, Harrisonburg, Lynchburg, Roanoke, Wytheville, and Wise regions. The following supplies are needed: pencils, notebooks, crayons, construction paper, inexpensive calculators, glue sticks, hand sanitizer, paper towels, and facial tissues. # KICK OFF A HEALTHY NEW YEAR AND JOIN THE FUN!
