How Do Substance Use Disorders Develop?

Speaker: Amy Rugh, MEd, LPC, Centra Behavioral Health

Substances such as opioid medications, tranquilizers, alcohol, and nicotine change the way we feel. They elevate the mood, produce relaxation, and relieve pain. They produce these effects by acting on the brain. What are the mechanisms by which these effects occur? How does dependence on substances develop? How can our substance use behaviors, including the use of narcotic pain relievers, influence the development of substance use problems? Is development of dependence possible after even short-term



use? Is it possible to develop dependence on activities as well as on substances? What effect does the stigmatization of substance use disorders have? These and other physical and psychological dependency issues will be addressed by our speaker.

Speaker: Richard Tugman CEO, Centra Health





THE HEART OF CHRISTIANITY

Rediscovering a Life of Faith

In <u>The Heart of Christianity</u>, world-renowned Jesus scholar, Marcus Borg, argues that the essential ingredients of a Christian life—faith, being born again, the kingdom of God, the gospel of love—are as vitally important today as they have always been, even during this time of conflict and change in the Church.

Borg wants to show us, as today's thinking Christians, how to discover a life of faith by reconceptualizing familiar beliefs. Being born again, for example, has nothing to do with fundamentalism, but is a call to radical personal



transformation. Talking about the kingdom of God does not mean that you are fighting against secularism, but that you have committed your life to the divine values of justice and love. Living the true Christian way is essentially about opening one's heart—to God, and to others. Above all else, Borg believes with passion and conviction that living the Christian life still makes sense.

Father Richard Rohr teaches that God gives us our soul—our True Self—from the very start. We lose sight of that True Self as we learn not only to survive but to thrive in the world. We develop an ego which seeks to protect us from the hurt and trauma we encounter along the way. This is the necessary work of the first half of life. But too often the ego becomes a mask—a False Self which hides our soul. In the second half of life, we can learn to take off the mask, rediscover our True Self and begin to live our own unique God-given destiny. The Enneagram is a valuable tool that can help us take off the mask and learn to see ourselves—and others—as God sees us.

In the very first book of the Bible, we learn the good news that we are created in the image of God. In short order we also learn the bad news—that image has become tarnished. In our study of the Enneagram, we will come to understand that God's grace is the good news that provides a way out of the bad news.

In the Winter Sessions of this class, we will learn what blinds us from seeing our True Self (our soul), what separates us (our sin) from God, and what makes it difficult (again, our sin) to get along with others. As the Winter Sessions lead us into Lent and toward the Spring of Resurrection, we will discover the grace that transforms us into the unique gift we are created to be.
