CHRISMONS AND CAROLS FOR ADVENT

On Sunday, December 15, we will again experience Chrismons & Carols, where six of our handmade Advent Chrismons will each be associated with a lesson and a carol that offer insight into that particular Chrismon's imagery. For instance, the "Cross in Eternity" Chrismon will be associated with Isaiah 40: "Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength." The associated carol will be "Prepare the Way, O Zion," by Robert Lau. On Sunday, December 29, we will experience Chrismons & Carols with an emphasis on the Christmas story.

ADVENT OFFERINGS

Our special Advent offerings are used for the broader work of the Lutheran Church through the Virginia Synod. One of those ministries is enCircle, formerly known as Lutheran Family Services of Virginia. What was started by a Lutheran pastor as a small orphanage in Salem back in 1888 has evolved into an organization that provides a broad array of educational and social services for children, adults, and families. EnCircle's 550 staff and caregivers work with vulnerable citizens across Virginia to restore the promise that life offers. They offer children the comfort, love, and safety of foster or adoptive families; empower people with developmental disabilities through a variety of community-based services; provide trauma-informed counseling to children, adults, and families; and, their Minnick Schools help children thrive in school, family, and life. We are proud of the broad mission outreach of our Church and are challenged to give it our generous support. Offerings may be made using the special Advent envelopes included in our envelope packets or through the online giving portal available on our website by selecting the Seasonal Special Offerings fund.

2025 ALTAR FLOWERS and CANDLE DEDICATIONS
